Main Bible verse
[Acts 9:15]

But the Lord said to Ananias, "Go! I have chosen this man to work for me.

When Saul opened his eyes he could see nothing so the men traveling with Saul led him by the hand into Damascus.

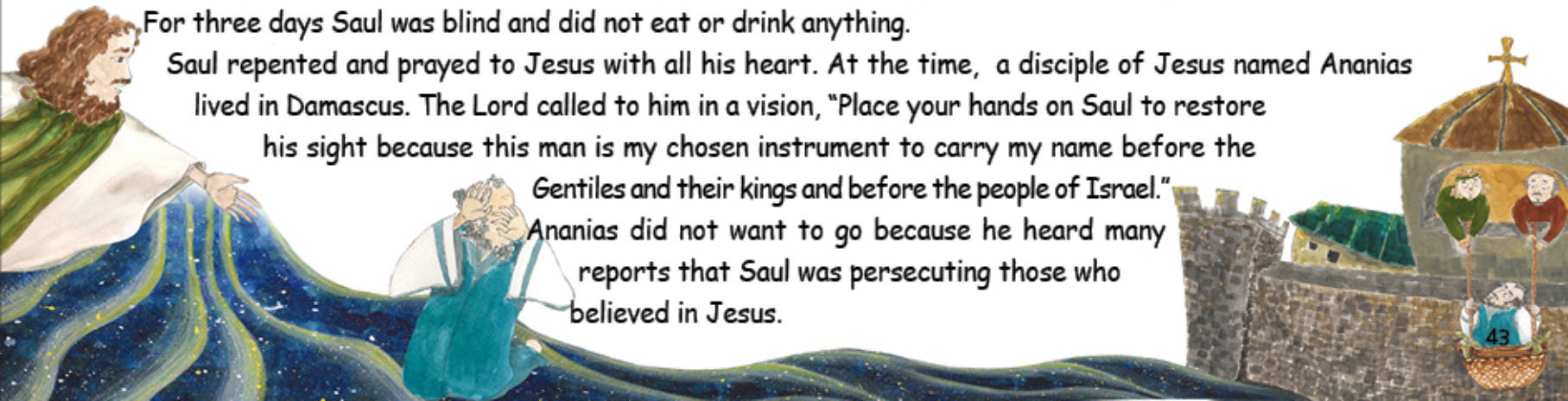
For three days Saul was blind and did not eat or drink anything.

b. In Ananias' dream, what did Jesus say about Paul?

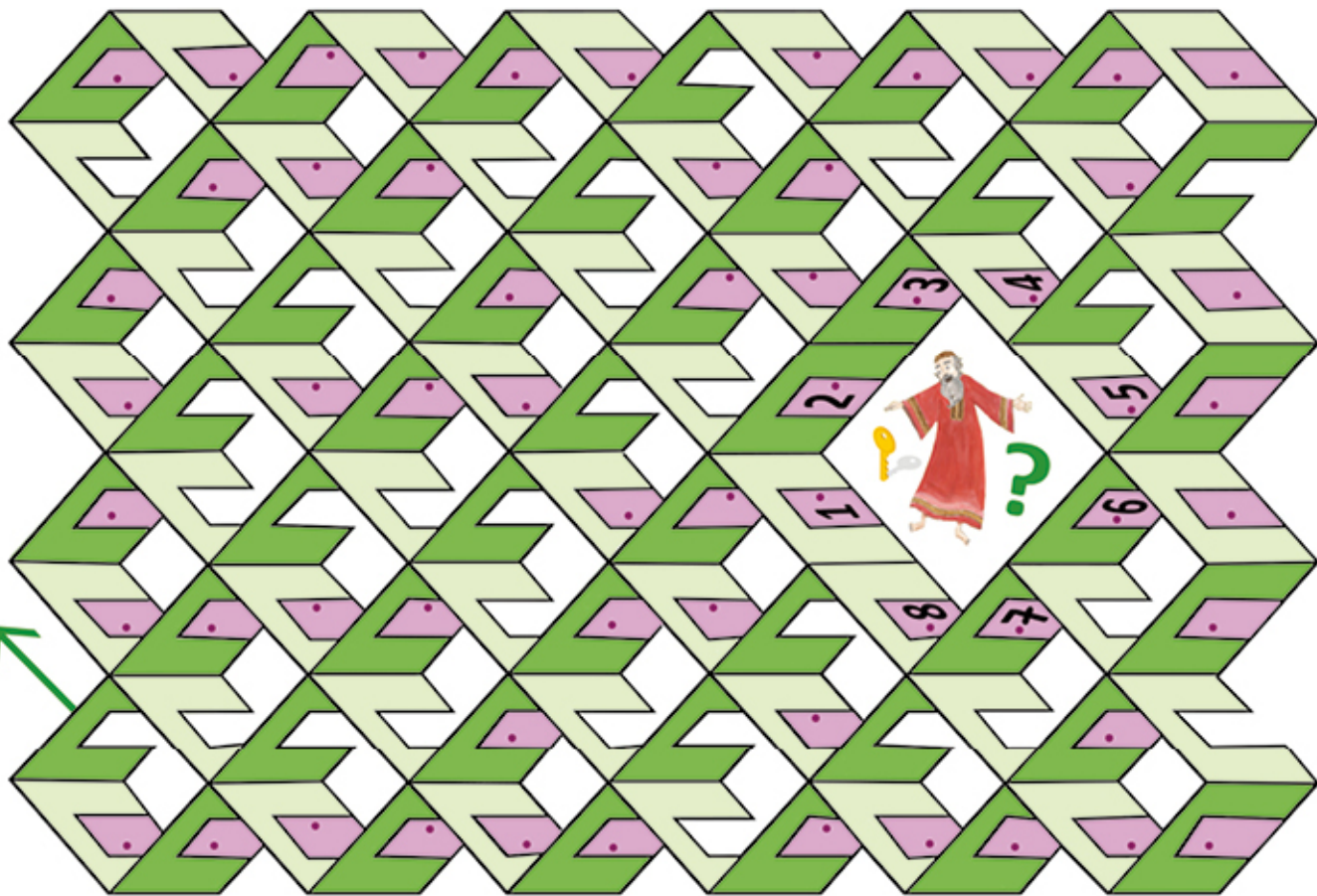
c. Read Acts 9:17-25 and answer: according to Paul, who is Jesus?
