[Judges 16:20b]

In an instant the temple was destroyed and all the Philistines in it died.

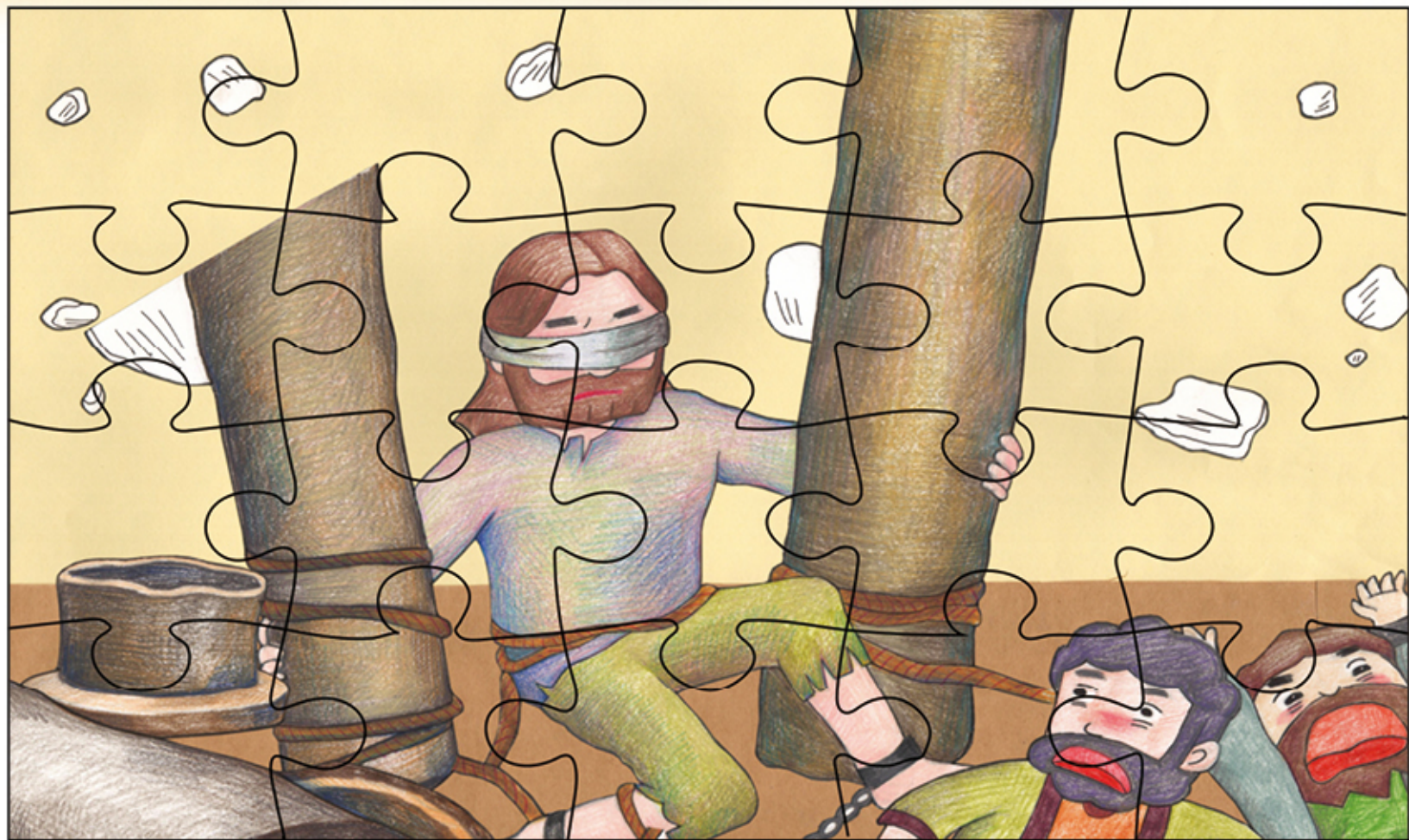
The number of people who died with Samson was much greater than the number of people he had killed when he had been alive. In this way, Samson died with the Philistines.
