David's father had instructed him to go to the battlefield to deliver something to his brothers.

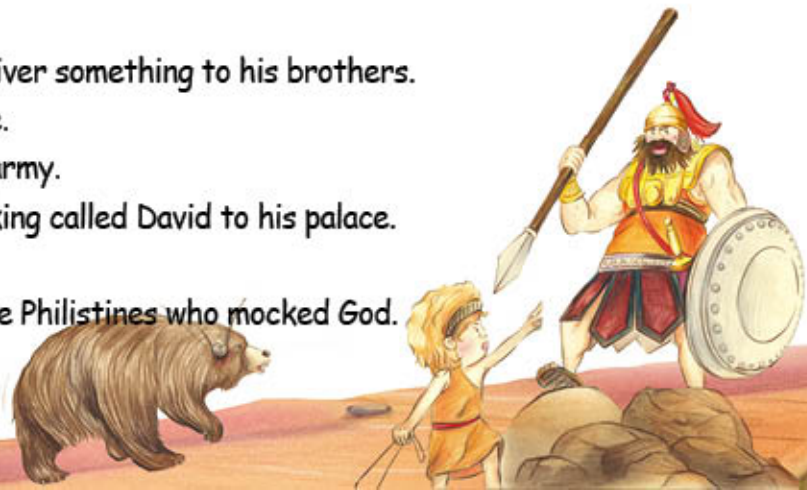
When he got there he saw how Goliath was mocking God's people.

When the Philistines saw that their hero was dead, they turned and ran. The Israelites triumphed that day.

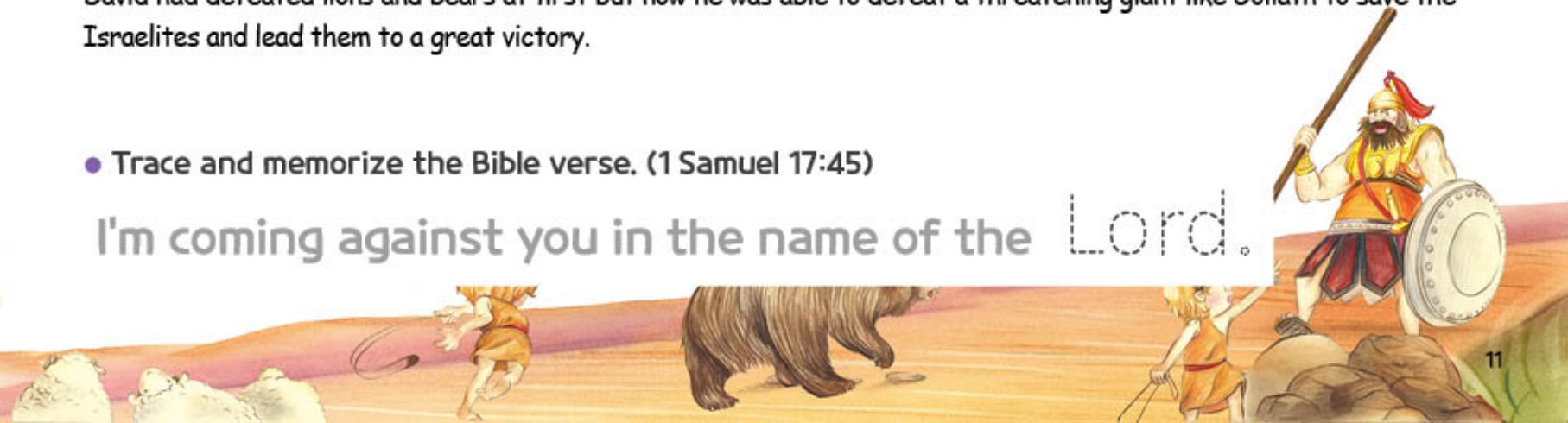
Just as he had believed in and trusted God whenever he was faced with a fearsome lion or a grizzly bear,
