[1 Kings 3:9-10]

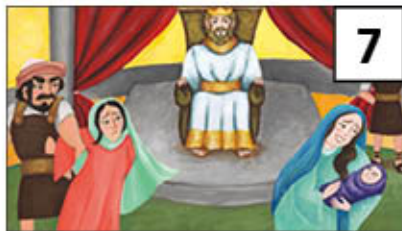
