Main Bible verse
[Exodus 2:10b]

One day, an Israelite woman gave birth to a son.

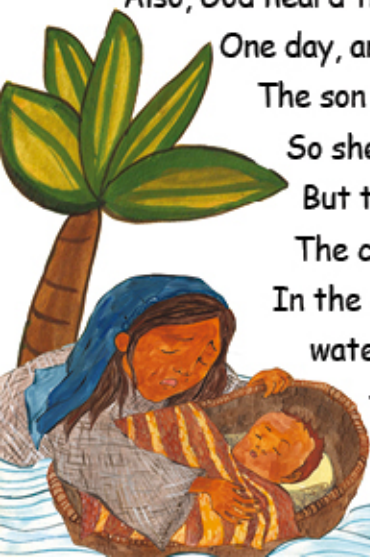
The son was so handsome and lovable that his mother simply could not throw him into the Nile.

- Read and memorize the Bible verse. (Exodus 2:10b)

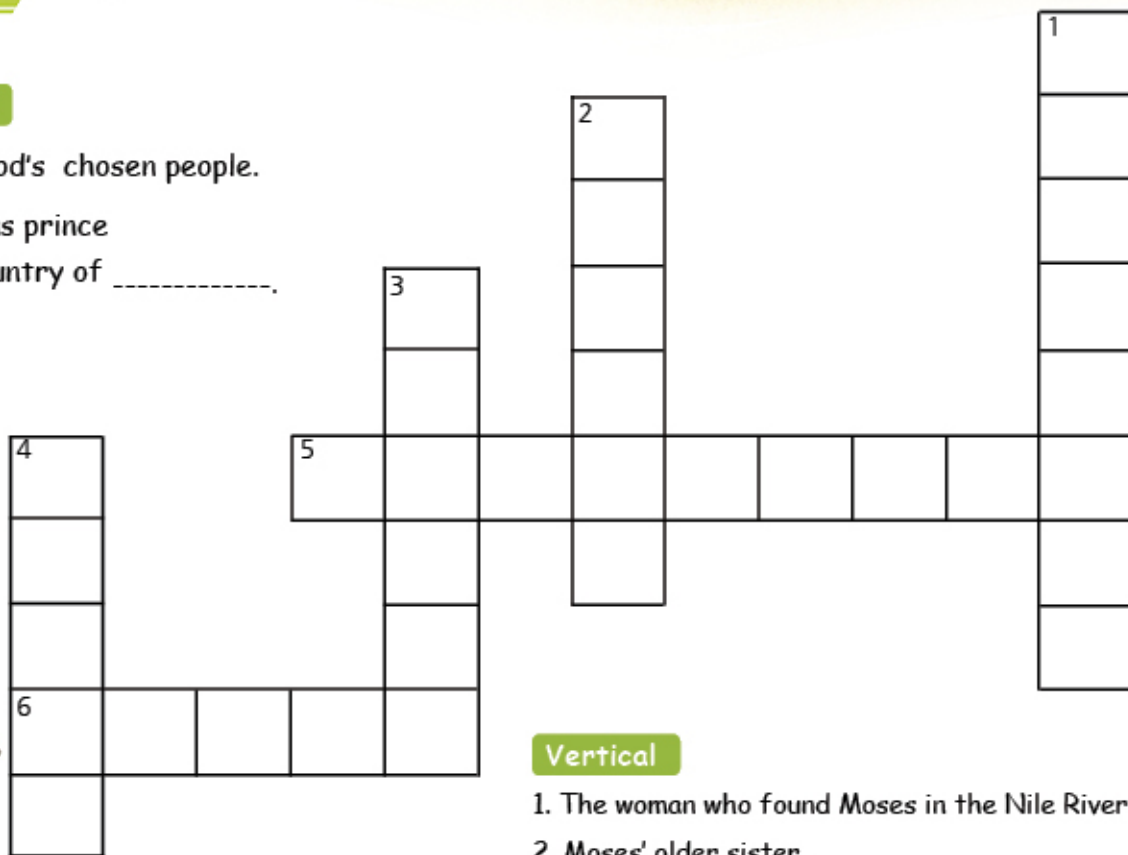
