Main Bible verse  
[Exodus 3:10]

At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God.

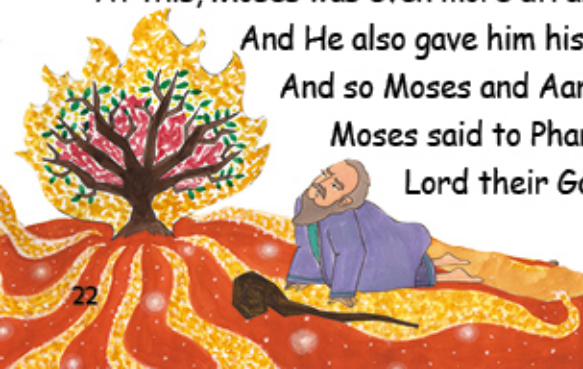

Finally, the Israelites were able to leave Egypt with Moses.

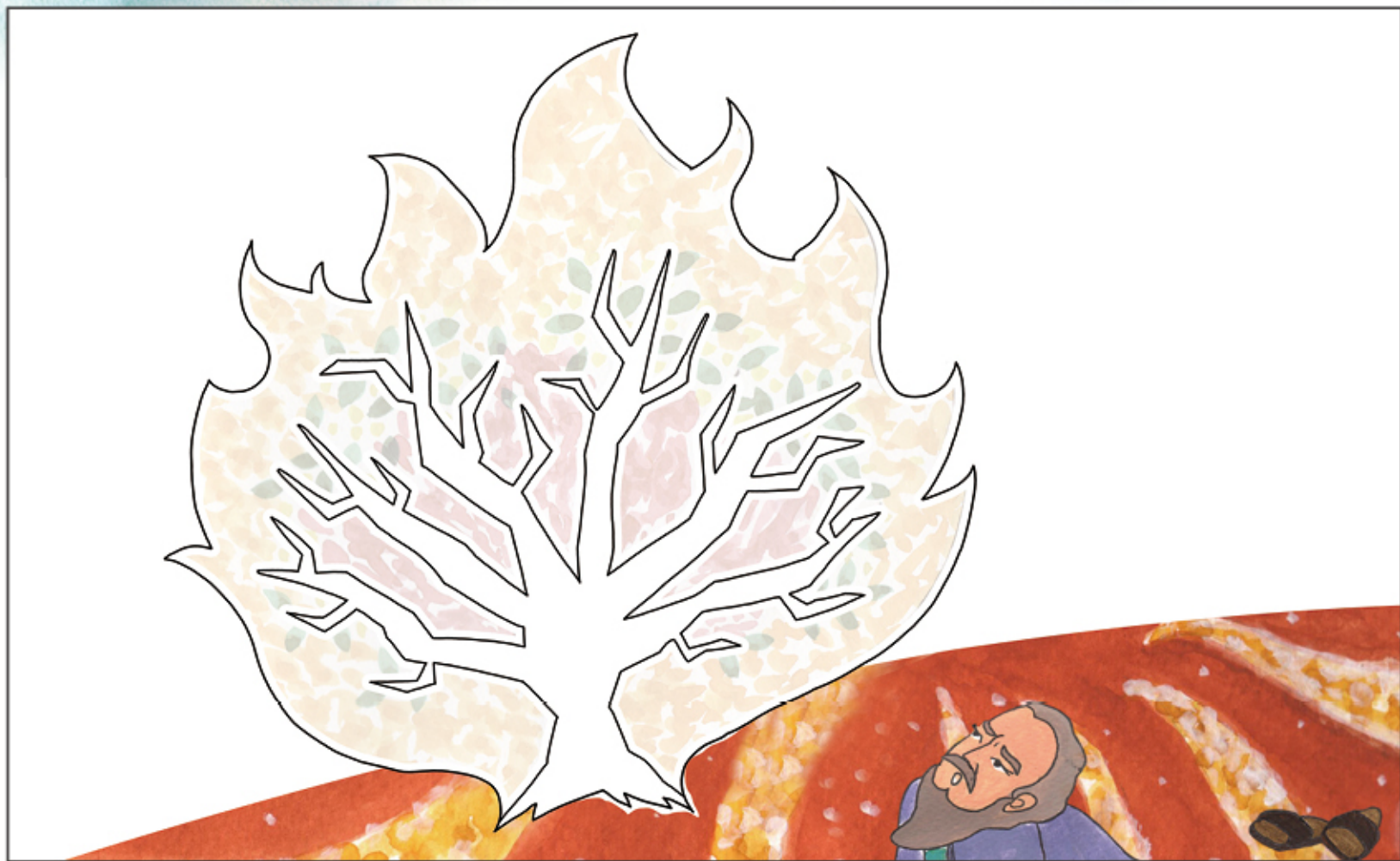
- Trace and memorize the Bible verse. (Exodus 3:10)
